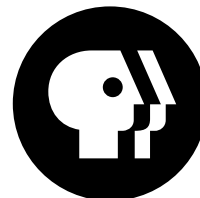
WNIT is located in the Center for Public Media, but all of Michiana is our studio. Through our local programs and documentaries, from the OUR TOWN series to FARM FRESH TO YOU, from DINNER AND A BOOK to our newest program, EXPERIENCE MICHIANA, we tell the stories of Michiana by the people of Michiana.

Geographically, Michiana covers approximately 17 counties in northern Indiana and five in southwestern Michigan. It stretches from the lakeshore along Lake Michigan to the Amish communities in LaGrange County, Indiana. It is an area of farms and fields, factories and fisheries. It is dotted with hundreds of small lakes and borders Lake Michigan. Michiana contains cities, towns and villages, major colleges and universities, incredible agriculture and world-class manufacturing. The region is drained by two major rivers, the St. Joseph and the Kankakee, which come within a few miles of each other at a location designated as a north-south continental divide. Waters to the north and east of the divide flow into the Great Lakes while waters to the south and west of that demarcation flow into the Mississippi and down to the Gulf of Mexico.

But it is the people that make Michiana special. Where in this world are you going to find people of such talent and diversity, people who are so open and friendly and helpful? The people of Michiana are educated and hard-working, specializing in fields such as education and farming, orthopedics and engineering. That's why we're so excited about EXPERIENCE MICHIANA. It gives us the opportunity to spotlight individuals and organizations in our community who have a story to tell. Our camera crews have recorded everything from the wooden carousel horses in St. Joseph to the New York Central Railroad Museum in Elkhart. Host Gordy Young has taken part in a Japanese Tea Ceremony in Mishawaka, ridden a powered parachute in Plymouth and interviewed people ranging from Venetia Sekema to South Bend Mayor Pete Buttigieg. There are about 1.3 million viewers in the Michiana area and we would like to reach each and every one of them.

Just as WNIT is so much more than just a channel on the dial, Michiana is so much more than an area on a map. For us, Michiana is home. In the past few years, we have produced OUR TOWN: GOSHEN, OUR TOWN: WARSAW - WINONA LAKE and we are currently working on another edition of OUR TOWN for this summer. All of Michiana is indeed our studio. Our ongoing, overarching aim is to tell the story of OUR TOWN: MICHIANA.

### JESSE OWENS: AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

TUESDAY, MAY 1, 8PM   
AND THURSDAY, MAY 3, 9PM 

On April 2, 1936, when the 22-year-old son of a sharecropper entered the Olympic Stadium in Berlin, he was, he later remembered, barely able to control his anger. “I was angry because of the insults that Hitler and the other German leaders had hurled at me and my Negro teammates on the Olympic squad.” The young athlete would channel his raw emotions into some of the most remarkable achievements in the history of athletics, winning four gold medals. Despite his success in Germany, Owens struggled to find a place for himself in a United States that was still wrestling to overcome its own deeply entrenched racism.

### FRONTLINE “MONEY, POWER AND WALL STREET”

TUESDAY, MAY 1, 9PM

Since 2008, Wall Street and Washington have fought against the tide of the fiercest financial crisis since the Great Depression. What have they wrought? In a special four-hour investigation, FRONTLINE tells the inside story of the struggles to rescue and repair a shattered economy, exploring key decisions, missed

opportunities, and the unprecedented and uneasy partnership between government leaders and titans of finance that affects the fortunes of millions of people around the world.

### PART 2

– MAY 7, 8PM 

Host Mark L. Walberg joins appraiser Sebastian Clarke at the American Swedish Institute to discuss Mora clocks, beautiful tall case timekeepers cherished by many Swedish-Americans who immigrated to the U.S. in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Highlights include a questionable George Elmslie chair that, if authentic, could fetch \$50,000; a 1900 McKinley-Roosevelt poster discovered at a flea market; and a 1976 fancy intense yellow diamond ring, valued at \$140,000-\$160,000.

The program explores the science of slithering, as well as the development of “infra-red goggles” that let the snakes hunt warm-blooded prey in the dark and a flexible jaw that allows them to stretch their mouths around huge prey, including alligators.

Full song performances include "Body and Soul" (with Amy Winehouse), "The Lady Is a Tramp" (with Lady Gaga), "Speak Low" (with Norah Jones), "The Way You Look Tonight" (with Faith Hill), "It Had to Be You" (with Carrie Underwood), "On the Sunny Side of the Street" (with Willie Nelson) and many more.

## MONARCHY: THE ROYAL FAMILY AT WORK

It's from here that the queen directs the business of the royal family, entertains heads of state and conducts her private life. The queen's guests will stay in Buckingham Palace's 11 royal suites, where meticulous footmen will valet for them. For the magnificent banquet, the queen personally reviews the table arrangements, and the royal chef certifies that the presentation of every plate is perfect.

"HEAD OF STATE" – JUNE 25, 10PM

For the dramatic ritual that opens Parliament, the queen's coachmen don full livery, and two of her horse-drawn carriages parade through the streets. One holds the queen — the other carries the crown jewels. "Head of State" also attends the weekly private audience between Her Majesty and the British prime minister. In the historic visit to the Republic of Estonia, the ambassador, his wife and their staff have attended to every detail.

For two and a half years, Americans fought against the British, Canadian colonists and native nations. This film shows how the glories of war become enshrined in history, how failures are quickly forgotten and how inconvenient truths are ignored forever. ### QUEEN VICTORIA’S EMPIRE

TUESDAYS, JUNE 19-26, 8PM 

#### “ENGINES OF CHANGE / PASSAGE TO INDIA”

Beginning with the birth of Queen Victoria, this episode explores the changes brought to Britain by the industrial revolution. By the 1840s, urban migration has created overcrowding and extremes in pollution and poverty.

In the 1850s, one half of the world’s industrial goods are made in Britain, and steamships take British exports and families to far corners of the globe. India explodes in the Great Mutiny and Cawnpore massacre of 1857. Appalled by the bloodshed, Victoria and Albert assume direct rule over India. The episode also reveals the devastating effects of the Crimean War, the first major war of Victoria’s reign, and the death of Prince Albert.

#### “THE MORAL CRUSADE / THE SCRAMBLE FOR AFRICA”

By 1861, Britain is the wealthiest and most powerful nation on earth. Disraeli and Gladstone battle for control of the British government and debate the course of the empire. The purchase of the Suez Canal solidifies British presence in the Middle East, igniting a stampede for the colonization of Africa.

As Victoria celebrates her Diamond Jubilee, the empire is on the verge of its darkest hours. The Boer War leads to devastating losses and a reassessment of British purpose. Finally, in 1901, the death of Queen Victoria marks the end of an extraordinary era.

### MORRISTOWN: WHERE AMERICA SURVIVED

SUNDAY, JUNE 24, 10PM

This documentary revisits the winter of 1779-80, when General Washington’s troops arrived at the densely wooded area just south of Morristown, known as Jockey Hollow, to build a log hut city for their winter camp. The film is an eye-opening look at how the camp saved the army — and the American Revolution — from the brink of disaster.

#### “CAMEL” – JUNE 27

Mark Evans and Joy Reidenberg brave the baking desert to dissect a camel.
